Projects Year in Review

Help Save Lives: Mankoe Foundation: FOL sent funds to the Mankoe Foundation to purchase chickens and pigs to feed orphans and other youth. The chickens and pigs are taken care of until they are ready to be sold in the market. The animals are replaced after every sale to sustain the programs and to pay for student fees, books, uniforms and other essentials.

FOL wired a \$4,000 donation made by William Stafford Noble (PCV1991-1993, **Mt. Tabor in Mafeteng**) for the building of new dormitories. The school currently has 900 students.

FOL has been facilitating fundraising led by Kenneth Tucceri for the construction of a new library. The \$25,000 project will benefit students at the **Mokoko Primary School in Thaba Tseka**.

FOL is serving as Fiscal Agent on behalf of Jan Brabham and Keefe Kalil for a project to collect and distribute funds for the **Molete Foundation** to buy land to build a literacy center directed by Monica Letsoha.

US Ambassador Urges Basotho to Explore US Markets

United States Ambassador to Lesotho, Maria Brewer, encouraged Basotho to explore products to sell duty free to the US market under the African Growth and Opportunity Act (AGOA), to lessen the economic setbacks resulting from the drop in textile and apparel production.

Since 2020, the textile and apparel manufacturing industry has laid off up to 22 000 employees.

It is under this background that economists and the US Embassy in Lesotho have encouraged the country to explore more export options to take full advantage of AGOA.

Prison Death Toll

According to Lesotho Correctional Services (LCS) records, 68 inmates have died in incarceration between 2017 and 2023.

This data was included in Ombudsman, Advocate Tlotliso Polaki's report on the condition of Lesotho's prisons and hospitals titled 'Hospitals, Human Rights Inspection Reports'.

The report highlights indicates the following conditions in correctional facilities: inhumane living conditions, underfeeding, inadequate ablution facilities, poor ventilation, poor healthcare services, lack of sanitation and privacy, and shortage of mattresses and blankets.

The report says inmates are served porridge (sometimes without sugar) for breakfast, while hard porridge (pap) with beans or peas are served for lunch and dinner daily all year round. They only have varieties of eggs, vegetables, milk, and meat on Christmas Day.

Impact of Avian Flu Chicken Import Ban

The government's imposed a ban on chicken imports following the outbreak of Avian Influenza in South Africa in June this year. As a result, restaurants and retailers have temporarily closed or have notified customers that they do not have chicken products. Most of the chickens and chicken products consumed in Lesotho are imported from South Africa.

US Investments in Lesotho

The US has awarded a \$300 million Health and Horticulture Compact grant through the Millennium Challenge Corporation (MCC). The funds are part of the USA Assistance Strategy for Lesotho and will be used to improve the quality of life for Basotho, strengthen the business environment, and promote economic diversification for inclusive and job-creating growth.

Prime Minister Ntsokoane Matekane stated that, "In the upcoming year, the government will prioritise prioritize policies to address the shortcomings in fiscal policy, trade policy, land rights, and access" He further commented on efforts towards gender equality, technology and innovation, and elimination of corruption.


