Mission, Purpose, Values, History

Mission

Friends of Lesotho (FOL) is a non-profit organization promoting friendship between the peoples of Lesotho and the U.S.

Purpose

The purpose of FOL is to serve as a point of contact and funding source for scholarships and grants to small development projects in Lesotho. FOL accomplishes its mission and purpose by:

- Ensuring good governance of the organization with fiscal responsibility
- Keeping members and friends up to date on news about Lesotho, via a quarterly newsletter, website and other social media resources
- Providing members and friends with information on the needs of the people of Lesotho and opportunities for support
- Conducting annual appeals for donations along with a variety of fundraising activities
- Providing direct assistance to worthy projects (i.e., orphan care, HIV/AIDS education, life skills training and education, business development, school repair and construction, scholarships, and other needs as identified
- Providing oversight and accountability of funds sent to Lesotho
- Reporting to members and friends on the performance of the organization and accomplishments through an Annual Report.

Values

- FOL values the friendship between the people of Lesotho and the U.S.
- FOL is comprised of both former Peace Corps Volunteers and others who have an interest in Lesotho.
- FOL partners with U.S. Peace Corps Volunteers serving in Lesotho, as well as with other individuals and NGOs who seek our assistance and wish to cooperate on joint ventures.
- ◆ FOL strives to "make a difference at the grassroots level", funding projects considered too small by major donor organizations. Project funding decisions are reviewed by the Board of Directors, following recommendations from the Donations Committee to ensure projects are worthy of funding and are adequately monitored.
- FOL is affiliated with the National Peace Corps Association and has agreements to work through the U.S. Peace Corps Partnership Program in Lesotho. FOL also enters into Memoranda of Understanding (MOU) with individuals and groups sponsoring education and development projects in Lesotho.

History

FOL is a registered nonprofit organization formed in 1985 by a small group of Washington, D.C. RPCVs, most of whom served in Lesotho in the 1960s and 70s. FOL now has members from almost every US State, and from abroad. The all-volunteer Board of Directors and committee members guide the organizational activities by meeting regularly online or by teleconference.


Tuition Assistance Program (TAP)

Special thanks to the Taipei American School for their donation of \$12,561.80 last year and member contributions over \$1,000. This generous support enabled FOL to fund over 60 students this school year.

FOL was very fortunate to be able to again partner with the Rotary Clubs of Maloti, Matsopa, and Maseru to reach out to principals across Lesotho and help identify students for the scholarships. TAP funds were also sent to Monica Letsoha at the Molete Foundation for additional scholarships.

FOL received numerous Thank You letters from students who received TAP funding this year.









Paleng Place of Stories

An MOU was approved by the board to send a \$3,000 donation to Paleng Place of Stories. Paleng is a children's library in Malealea Valley, Lesotho.

At Paleng they create bilingual picture storybooks specifically for children in rural communities. All of their books are written, illustrated, translated, and produced by the Paleng team. Support for Molete Foundation

FOL served as Fiscal Agent on behalf of Jan Brabham and Keefe Kalil for a project to collect and distribute funds for the Molete Foundation to buy land and build a literacy center directed by Monica Letsoha.

Mount Tabor School

FOL wired a \$4,000 donation made by William Stafford Noble (PCV 1991-1993 at Mt. Tabor in Mafeteng) for the building of new dormitories at the school. The high school currently educates 900 students.






Library for Mokoko Primary School

Other projects that received FOL support

Help Save Lives: Mankoe Foundation

FOL sent funds of \$1,571 to the Mankoe Foundation to build an animal shelter and to purchase chickens and pigs to feed orphans and other youth. The chickens and pigs will be taken care of until they are ready to be sold in the market. The animals will be replaced after every sale to sustain the programs to pay for student fees, books, uniforms, and other essentials.

Peace Corps Partnership Program — Lesotho Country Fund

FOL's contributions to the Lesotho Country Fund continue to support sustainable, community-driven projects in Lesotho that are led by Peace Corps Volunteers. There are currently 47 PCVs in Lesotho, mainly in Education or Health related positions. In 2023, FOL donated \$2,000 to Lesotho's Peace Corps Partnership Program.



Social Media Committee Report

The Website Committee at Friends of Lesotho (FOL) has remained committed to maintaining an engaging online presence, ensuring that our website, rebuilt on Squarespace a couple of years ago, remains current and informative. Throughout the year, we have diligently updated the website with the latest news, events, and project information, offering visitors a comprehensive overview of FOL's endeavors. Additionally, we have enhanced user experience by implementing a streamlined donation process on our PayPal page, allowing donors to allocate their contributions to specific projects of their choice. This innovation has empowered supporters to direct their funds towards initiatives that resonate most with them, fostering a deeper sense of connection and investment in our mission.

Moreover, our Facebook page continues to serve as a vital platform for engaging with Returned Peace Corps Volunteers (RPCVs) and other FOL supporters. Through regular updates, event promotions, and interactive content, we have cultivated a vibrant online community where members can connect, share experiences, and stay informed about FOL's activities. Notably, this year, we leveraged Facebook to amplify the reach of our participation in Peace Corps Week, successfully bringing together over 70 individuals for an impactful event. As always, our website remains a repository of valuable resources, housing archived newsletters and annual reports for easy access. For those who haven't yet joined our community, we extend a warm invitation to visit our website, fill out the membership form, and become part of our growing network of advocates for Lesotho.

Membership Committee Report

Since 2017, basic membership in Friends of Lesotho is free. Interested persons can sign up for membership through the FOL website (www.friendsoflesotho.org), following the prompts under the "Contact Us" tab. Current members can also <u>update changes to their contact information</u> (email or physical address; name changes, etc.) following those same prompts. As of end of 2023, FOL has grown to 963 members.

Members automatically receive the quarterly FOL Newsletter (published three times a year) by email. The newsletter provides news about Lesotho, as well as updates on the various activities of FOL. Members also receive other information relevant to the organization, such the Annual Report, board member elections, and similar information.

The Membership Committee often gets requests to help people find others that they have lost contact with, for instance RPCVs who are trying to find colleagues they served with. If you are trying to get in touch with someone, you can contact us through the website's "Contact Us" tab—General Inquiry. If we have contact information for that person, we'll contact them to see if it's okay to share their information with you.

Fundraising Committee Report

FOL concentrated its fundraising efforts in 2023 through an end-of-year email appeal, with some letters mailed to members and friends for whom an email address was unavailable. FOL also launched a new fundraising campaign using **ShopRaise** listed at the end of this Report under *Ways to Give*.

FOL is grateful for all donations received throughout the year. With much appreciation to all of our many generous donors for their support.
